- They are ones involved in using renewable plant and animal resources to produce food, fuel, chemistry, and other materials.
 - <u>Bioscience: Jobs, Investments and Innovation 2014</u>: **1.62 million** people working across **73,000 individual business establishments** <u>Battelle</u> and <u>Biotechnology Industry Organization (BIO)</u>
- Bioeconomy is built on vast landscape of many sectors
 - Energy biomass, waste-to-energy, Switchgrass
 - Agriculture sustainable agriculture, nutrient recovery, forestry
 - Manufacturing green roofs/blankets, green chemistry
 - Products food, health and beauty, automotive parts
