





Key takeaways:

- Current economic models are deeply inadequate in capturing the opportunities of such a transformational shift to address climate change, or the grave dangers of climate inaction.
- Need a new class of economic models that can capture the powerful dynamics at play, including transformative technological advances, preservation of essential natural capital, and the full health benefits of cleaner air and a safer climate, including the containment of pandemic diseases.
- Bold action on low carbon growth could yield a direct economic gain of US\$26 trillion through to 2030 compared with business-as-usual. And this is likely to be a conservative estimate.
- The challenge now is to accelerate the transition to a better, more inclusive, new climate economy in five key economic systems: energy, cities, food and land use, water, and industry.






